The Social Justice Services division of Community Resources for Justice provides residential and non-residential services and programming.

We firmly believe that change is possible and attainable for all whom we serve. With a keen focus on outcomes, the Social Justice Services Division is committed to delivering evidence-based services and interventions to the adults and young people in our care.

We operate seven residential reentry centers in Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New York, and Rhode Island that help men and women transitioning from incarceration back to the community to obtain full-time employment, stable housing, education and training, and substance abuse and mental health services.

Evidence-based practices:

In all of our programs we adhere to evidence-based practice. From assessment using the ORAS (Ohio Risk Assessment System) to Program Plan development, services are delivered in accordance with EPICS (Effective Practices in Correctional Settings) with progress documented and measured.
